I hope you are all well and in good health. As we begin our communal journey into our second national lockdown period, we are writing to you to be in touch. It is a deeply challenging and difficult time for us all, especially as the glorious, partly sunny days of autumn are fading away gradually. Yet without hope and new opportunities. it's more essential than ever to be together in this time as a church family. Our prayer for us all is to be able to find hope and strength in God of our salvation, may we have as surefooted while we tread upon the heights a head of us.

In a positive note, we are more ready this time as there is much that we have learned from the first lockdown. To be patient with ourselves, to be realistic in our expectation knowing that this time is demanding on us more than we are actually think, to notice our feelings and to be aware of other people around us despite keeping the distance. Learning the art of "BEING" more than "DOING". All these are good lessons we need to continue building on them in this second round.



Last Tuesday we met online as a ministry group in Zoom, to reflect on “as our God is with us, how could we, in this time of uncertainties, be with God, each other and our community? Some good ideas emerged from that meeting; we will share some of them with you in this letter. As part of being with each other Lynne and Revd Adel are planning to share with you a weekly message of encouragement and support, such as this one, so watch the space.

Sunday’s worship

As a church, we plan to provide opportunities for people to worship online. Morning prayer via Zoom application on Sundays at 10:30 am (the link of the service will be sent by email during the next week and more details in the newsletter, Facebook page and the website).

This Sunday we will hold a short Remembrance Service outside in the churchyard at 10.45 am (gathering in from 10:30 am) and will observe the two-minute silence at 11 am. Whilst public services in church must stop for the time being, we are grateful that the new guidelines allow churches to open for individual prayer. Do please use the Parish church building for private prayer between 10.30 and 11.30 am each Sunday, ensuring you follow the guidelines.

Pray & Fast.

On All Saints’ Day, the Archbishops wrote to the clergy and lay ministers of the Church of England. Within the letter, they are calling for us all to make this month of lockdown a month of prayer. They are also inviting those who are physically able, to consider fasting in a way appropriate to each of us every Thursday, in the same way that we cheered for the NHS during the first lockdown. We are invited **each Thursday to fast and pray** for our nation, for its leaders, its health and essential services, and for all those that suffer. If you’ve not fasted before, a typical fast would be



to refrain from food during the hours of daylight (feel free to decide for how long), and to use the time that you would normally spend to prepare and eat a meal, to pray instead. You may feel that there is little you can do to help others during the pandemic, but even if you cannot fast, each and every one of us can pray. Lynne and Adel plan to hold a short service of Evening Prayer (by Zoom) on Thursdays in the coming weeks
