That rush hour thing at Windsor, being rather manic.

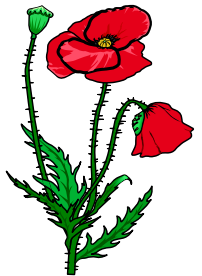
The Duke of York and Elton, both chilling in their homes;
